

#### Annual Support

# 2020 Manitoba Heritage Summit

# Fundraising Events & Project Updates

#### Fundraising Events

Due to COVID-19, Heritage Winnipeg was unable to host any in-person fundraising events. We hope to resume our annual events by the end of 2021 and in 2022.

#### The Millennium Centre - 389 Main Street

Heritage Winnipeg would like to thank the tenants and the entire team at WOW Hospitality Concepts, who did a fantastic job over the past year! We would like to again thank Parks Canada's Cost-Sharing Program and The Winnipeg Foundation for their generous grants enabling us to continue to restore the plaster in the main banking hall, repointing, and other critical maintenance work. Continued maintenance and restoration are very important components in preserving this landmark heritage building. In addition, filmmakers continue to utilize this unique space, helping support the viability of this building. This building continues to be a place for both private and public events. We look forward over the next few years to work on a plan for redeveloping the upper floors and after over four decades, finally bringing this heritage landmark back to full occupancy.

#### Upper Fort Garry Provincial Park

Heritage Winnipeg's Executive Director continues to be on the Friends of Upper Fort Garry's Board of Directors, which manages Upper Fort Garry Provincial Park. The Board continues to try and stay solvent during COVID-19, and looks forward to new programming and events soon.

#### Shards Project

Heritage Winnipeg continues to store shards (architectural building fragments) from demolished built heritage, ensuring they do not end up in a landfill. We hope to continue selling them once restrictions are lifted.

#### Streetcar 356 Rehabilitation Project

Work was paused in 2020-2021 due to COVID-19, but we were able to resume some work on Streetcar 356 in the spring of 2021. Thank you to all the volunteers and the Streetcar 356 Committee who continue to be committed to this project! More updates will be provided on our website.

#### Digital Museums Canada - DiscoverIT Architectural Website

Heritage Winnipeg would like to thank the newly named Digital Museums Canada for funding our bilingual DiscoverIt project during the 2020-2021 year. Heritage Winnipeg is working with Pattern Interactive and a stakeholder focus group. This project is expected to be completed in early 2022.

#### On This Spot App

The On This Spot app was launched during Doors Open Winnipeg 2018 with 100 historical photos and two self-guided historic walking tours, with support from Travel Manitoba and the Exchange District BIZ. We continue to work with On This Spot to broaden their work in Manitoba, including the creation of more historic tours throughout the province.

# Advocacy Updates

#### Gordon House - 514 Wellington Crescent

Heritage Winnipeg worked with the Crescentwood neighbourhood to assist in the "Save 514 Wellington" campaign. Strangely this stately house was not protected from demolition and left on the commemorative list. At the final hour, the Crescentwood neighbourhood was nominated as a Heritage Conservation District, resulting in the city signing a stop-work order that halted the demolition of the house. Sadly, the house had already been gutted inside, and many architectural character-defining elements were removed. The battle to save this home was fully embraced by the Crescentwood neighbourhood and all Winnipeggers. This issue with the developer was in litigation and sadly this heritage home has since been demolished.

#### Royal Albert Hotel - 48 Albert Street

Heritage Winnipeg continued to monitor the situation at this historic building, which is being operated as single residential occupancy, not a hotel. We have been following the negative impacts that activities associated with the management of this hotel are having on Albert Street and the West Exchange during the 2020-2021 year. We will continue to stay involved in the various issues surrounding this building and the adjacent buildings.

#### Armstrong's Point Neighbourhood

The Heritage Conservation Districts bylaw was successfully passed in spring of 2019 and Armstrong's Point Neighbourhood officially received Heritage Conservation District status! We were proud to be part of this long and arduous process, as it has opened the door to reviewing other significant historic areas of the city.

#### Dalnavert Museum and Visitors' Centre - 61 Carlton Street

During the 2020-2021 year the museum continued with operations by the Friends of Dalnavert Museum. The ongoing success is due to the efficient and effective management, staff, and Board of Directors. Heritage Winnipeg continues to promote various events at it throughout the year, including Doors Open Winnipeg. We are very proud to see the success of the new management after its reopening in 2015.

#### Carnegie Library / City of Winnipeg Archives - 380 William Avenue

Heritage Winnipeg met with staff within the City's Planning Department, and subsequently with an outside consulting company hired to interview stakeholders for the City's report. We continue advocating for the importance of moving the City Archives back into the building for its future sustainability. The building remains vacant with no commitment from the city to return. The report is anticipated to be released in 2021 with recommendations from the consulting company. Advocacy work will continue in the coming year.

#### Gregg Building - 52 Albert Street

Heritage Winnipeg continued to work with the new owner of the historic Gregg Building who is very passionate about rehabilitating and re-purposing it, so it can once again be an important part of the Exchange District's streetscape. The owner continued clean up and working on a feasible redevelopment plan for the building. He also graciously offered tours for tenants of 201 Portage Avenue in the previous year. In addition, he provided students participating in the National Trust for Canada Conference in October 2019 to tour the vacant heritage building. We will continue to support and work with the owner in the coming year.

#### Public Safety Building - 151 Princess Street

During 2020-2021, CentreVenture, with the support of the Mayor and the City of Winnipeg, continued with the demolition of the Public Safety Building and the Request for Proposals of a new building on the same land, but on the adjacent corner of Princess Street, called Market Lands. We were given access to the interior of the building in 2019 and it was in much better condition than expected! We were very sad to see this significant modernist building destroyed as opposed to repurposing for private and public space. Existing historic plaques on the property were protected and relocated.

## Advocacy Updates

#### Downtown Hudson's Bay Company Building - 450 Portage Avenue

An unofficial Friends of Hudson's Bay group spearheaded by Heritage Winnipeg continued with virtual discussions in 2020-2021, focused on issues facing the future of this historic landmark. Our hopes are still to have a public/private partnership to redevelop the building as a downtown community hub, so it can once again be an integral part of the historic, social, cultural, and economic landscape.

#### James Avenue Pumping Station - 109 James Avenue

To date, this project is almost complete, with the expectation of a sympathetic addition and rehabilitation of the historic building completed sometime in 2021-2022. It will be a residential and commercial redevelopment with a public space for gatherings. There have been some challenges along the way but we held our 2020 Annual Preservation Awards in the building, with guests given a tour of the spectacular repurposed space.

#### Siloam Mission Expansion - 300 Princess Street

The original building was officially designated by the City in 2017 and Siloam Mission then continued in 2020-2021 to complete their addition to the site.

#### Reliable Service Station - 98 Albert Street

Heritage Winnipeg continued to lobby other organizations to write the Councillors and the Mayor to stop the new proposed ultra-modern design at Arthur Street and Albert Street. It is in complete contrast to the historic brick and stone streetscape and on the pivotal corners of Albert, Bannatyne, and Arthur. Sadly, the former Service Station was passed over for designation, put on the City's Commemorative List rendering it unprotected and it was subsequently demolished by the owners. The City's design process for the new building involved the HBRC and UDAC, and without any explanation why an ultra-modern design would be preferred over a building that would continue the continuity of the existing streetscape in the West Exchange. It should be noted that movies are shot twice as often in the West Exchange compared to the East Exchange.

#### Rubin Block - 270 Morley Avenue

Heritage Winnipeg, along with the support of Fort Rouge residents, continued to work during the 2020-2021 year to possibly get this building sold and redeveloped. If sold, the building will be rehabilitated immediately with many affordable apartments, which are in high demand. Making it again a vibrant part of the community and viability is our highest priority.

#### St. Regis Hotel Oak Room - 285 Smith Street

Heritage Winnipeg, in partnership with Brock Coutts from Patent 5, successfully removed the character defining elements of the historic Oak Room in the summer of 2017, before the St. Regis Hotel was slated for demolition. Brock was able to sensitively remove the materials and recreated in part, the Oak Room as a tasting room in his micro-distillery in the East Exchange on Alexander Avenue. Patent 5 participated in Doors Open Winnipeg 2019, 2020 and 2021 to hugely interested crowds. It has

#### become a popular destination for visitors!

### Museums and Historic Properties Managed by Non-Profits

To date, there has been no report on the final recommendations regarding the management of City-owned and funded museums. We will continue to follow this issue.

#### City of Winnipeg Heritage Designations

During the 2020-2021 year, the Executive Director appeared in delegation via Zoom many times to both standing committees, EPC, and Council to advocate for designation and future protection of Winnipeg's built heritage.
