


Upper Fort Garry



Streetcar 356 has finished its route for the day, can you help it get back to the garage?






Did You Know?

From 1889 to 1955, the City of Winnipeg used streetcars instead of buses. In 1938, trolley buses began running alongside the streetcars.

Heritage Winnipeg owns the last remaining original wooden streetcar in Winnipeg, built in 1909. It lives at the Railway Museum in Union Station (123 Main Street).

The top of a column.




BASE

The bottom of a column.




SHAFT

The middle portion of a column.



PEDIMENT

A triangular shaped feature that sits above the entablature.



ENTABLATURE

A long rectangular band that fits between a capital and a pediment.



Did You Know?

It took seven years to build the Manitoba Legislative building on Broadway, from 1913 to 1920.

The Golden Boy was made in France in 1917 and spent several years aboard a French warship during the First World War before arriving in Winnipeg in 1919.
