Manitoba Underground Opera

PROJECT UPDATES

The Millennium Centre · 389 Main Street

Heritage Winnipeg continues to manage this historic building full time; learning, adapting, conserving and allowing it to contribute to the community. Weddings, films, fundraisers and events of all kinds, public and private, have used the building's elegant spaces throughout the year. As we persist in our goal to redevelop the building in its entirety – including the original brass cage elevator – we would like to thank The Winnipeg Foundation for their grant which has helped it remain viable.

Streetcar 356

After some uncertainty, Streetcar 356's current home, the Winnipeg Railway Museum in the history Union Station at 123 Main Street, has been secured for the next 25 years. Work on Streetcar 356 continued to be paused as Via Rail began repairing the roof and windows of the building, and there are also fire code issues that need to be addressed. We look forward to both the Museum reopening and work on Streetcar 356 resuming. Thank you to all the volunteers who continue to support the project!

Work continues on the beta version of this bilingual interactive project, created in collaboration with Pattern Interactive. Municipal Heritage Designations

Heritage Winnipeg has been tirelessly speaking in support of heritage designations at Winnipeg's City Hall. As a result, both the Odd Fellow Home (4025 Roblin Boulevard) and West Kildonan Library (365 Jefferson Avenue) were added to the City of Winnipeg's List of Historical Resources in January 2023 while the owners of Leacock House (442 Scotia Street) had their bid to remove the home's protective heritage designation denied. Unfortunately, efforts to have Roxy Lanes (385 Henderson Highway) designated were unsuccessful despite community support.


City of Winnipeg Archives

After years of advocacy by Heritage Winnipeg and others for the return of the City of Winnipeg Archives to their home in the Carnegie Library building (380 William Avenue), progress has been made! The City of Winnipeg's 2023 Capital Budget includes \$12.6 million for returning the archives to their historic home, which will be the perfect project to celebrate Winnipeg's 150th anniversary.

Crescentwood

Heritage Winnipeg was thrilled when Crescentwood-Enderton Park became Winnipeg's second Heritage Conservation District on March 23, 2023 after years of advocating alongside the community. We continue to work with residents to speak against the proposed historically insensitive redevelopment of 514 Wellington Crescent, which has been a serious concern after the demolition of the original historic house that stood on the property.

Heritage Winnipeg believes that protecting our community's built heritage fosters healthy, unique, dynamic, environmentally friendly and fiscally viable neighbourhoods that we can all be proud to call home for generations to come!

Exchange District

Heritage Winnipeg has continued to advocate for the appropriate design of the infill project proposed for 127 Bannatyne Avenue. While densification is important, so is maintaining the integrity of the streetscape in this national historic site. Meanwhile, Heritage Winnipeg is pleased to support the historically sensitive redevelopment of the Gregg Building (52 Albert Street), with an owner that has persevered through many obstacles.

Vacant Buildings

Heritage Winnipeg has spoken at City Hall in support of charging vacant building owners for fighting fires on their properties. We hope this will help end the rash of fires in vacant buildings and encourage vacant heritage building owners to redevelop or sell.

Downtown Hudson's Bay Company Building

Heritage Winnipeg is excited for the redevelopment of the Hudson's Bay Company Building (450 Portage Avenue) which was gifted to the Southern Chiefs' Organization. We hope this Indigenous mixed used project will return vibrancy to this landmark heritage building.

Beyond Winnipeg

With no provincial built heritage organization, Heritage Winnipeg has joined forced with the Kennedy house Renewal Committee to advocate for the conservation of the Captain Kennedy Tea House in St. Andrews. As a result of this partnership, the house is slowly moving towards being reopened with the Province undertaking necessary sewer, foundation and interior work.

Recognition

Heritage Winnipeg was honoured to be recognized by the Friends of West Kildonan Library for our advocacy work regarding the West Kildonan Library (365 Jefferson Avenue). It was a pleasure to work with such a dedicated group and we are elated that the library is now a protected heritage building. Thank you!
