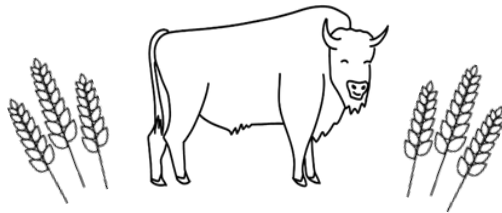

154 years ago today, on May 12, 1870, Manitoba officially became a province. The province was founded on the traditional lands of the Cree, Anishinaabe, Oji-Cree, Dakota/Lakota (Sioux), and Dene peoples, and on the homeland of the Métis Nation.

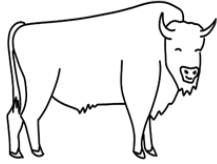

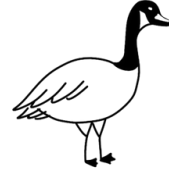

Did you know?

From 1889 to 1955, the City of Winnipeg used streetcars instead of buses. Heritage Winnipeg owns the last remaining original wooden streetcar in Winnipeg, Streetcar 356, built in 1909. It lives at the Railway Museum in Union Station, 123 Main Street.

Did you know?

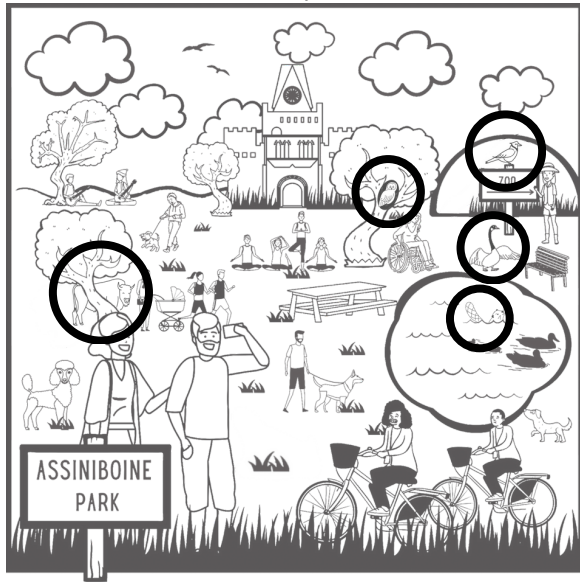
Tipis have been used by the Indigenous Peoples of the Prairies for thousands of years!

Tipis are portable shelters made from wooden poles and animal hide, bark or cloth coverings.

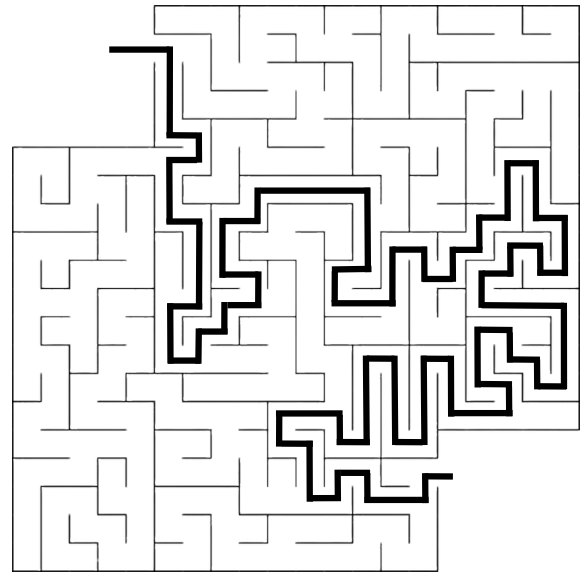

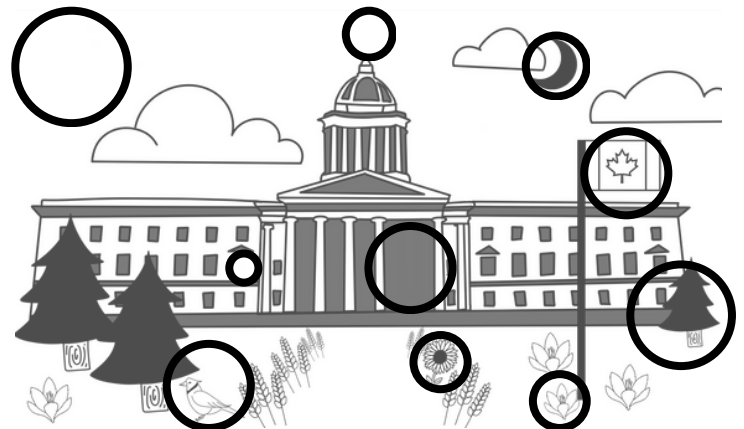
